## Code of Conduct for Junior Members



Lincoln Wellington Athletic Club (LWAC) is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members. The club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. As a member of LWAC, you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

All members must be polite and respect all coaches, officials, adults, and club members.

We all have the right to be treated equally. Respect the rights dignity and worth of everyone who uses the club regardless of their religion, ability, or cultural background.

Members should keep to agreed times, for training and competition. Training nights are 6.30 pm – 7.30 pm. In the winter we might finish a bit earlier but a child will never be left until they are picked up from the hut. In the summer, we quite often run over to take opportunity from the light nights. Again ensure a parent or carer picks all young athletes up from the track. Remember we are responsible for them until you pick them up.

## Code of Conduct for Junior Members



All members should wear appropriate clothing.

Shorts and t- shirts with jogging bottoms and sweat shirt or equivalent on top. Wet weather jackets or topcoats when the weather is not being kind to us, for training nights. Competition, all LWAC athletes are required to wear Club vests, black shorts.

All athletes must pay their subs within 4 weeks of joining the club, and paid annually in November thereafter. Competition fees should be paid to your coach before the event.

There is to be no chewing of gum whilst at the club either training or competition, due to the risk of choking. If caught chewing gum you will be asked to dispose of it into a bin immediately. There is to be no smoking or alcohol or the use of drugs, by juniors athletes, whilst at the club or representing the club.

These rules are for the safety of all young athletes, we hope you enjoy your time with us and if at any time you have any questions to ask please do not hesitate to approach a coach or Alison Dale the child welfare officer.
